

Friends, I spent some time this past Saturday morning meeting with the leaders and hosts of our Community Group ministry – what a pleasant time we had! These folks are committed to providing a platform for Spirit of Joy to live out our values. The Community Groups obviously practice Community, but are also committed to practicing Inclusion and Service as part of their regular routine. Even our 4th value, Worship, is honored by these groups since they link their discussion to the passage that was the focus of our worship service the prior Sunday.

We had a chance to hear each other's stories during our time together, but the leaders were also actively looking for opportunities to share with others in the congregation. We're going to find an appropriate forum for you to hear



directly from them (or from others in their groups) this Spring. In the meantime, let me share with you some of what I heard last Saturday.

One group was celebrating a group member who is not a member of Spirit of Joy, but who has been actively contributing to the Community Group. They are supporting her in the work she is doing in the community and she brings some additional and outside energy to the group. It was a great reminder of how we practice Inclusion through these groups – always inviting everyone to come alongside of us and experience growth and transformation. Another illustration of Inclusion was the way intergenerational connections are being made in the groups. Two of the four groups have Middle School students as regular, active participants (yes, it counts for confirmation credit!) and they are bringing different perspectives to the conversation topics. They are also getting to know adults in the congregation on a much deeper level – hearing and sharing their stories, serving together, and growing in faith.

Beyond Inclusion, one group had a story about a particularly difficult moment in a group member's life and how the group stopped, laid hands on that member, and

prayed together. This type of activity is indicative of the deep community described with the word *koinonia* in the New Testament. *Koinonia* is often translated "fellowship" but it does not describe superficial social interactions; it describes a deep participation in the life of another. That, more than anything else, is what it sounds like these groups are offering — deepening connection and a great sense of community... *koinonia*.

I'll save the rest of their stories so that they can share them. For now, please know you can still join one of these groups if you haven't already. (There are 4 groups meeting at 4 different times - Mondays at 7, Tuesdays at noon, Tuesdays at 7, and Wednesdays at 7.) It takes more than a meeting or two to really begin to experience what is happening in these groups, but if you make the commitment, what you get in return is invaluable.





THANK YOU FOR BEING A SUPPORTING CONGREGATION OF SKY RANCH LUTHERAN CAMP

<u>Thank you</u> again for your support of the ministry at Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp. You are one of the congregations of the Rocky Mountain Synod who use, own and operate this camp. Your prayers and financial help are very much appreciated. **As a seasonal Ministry, we serve over 3,000 youth and adults each year.**

On July 30th, Sky Ranch began construction on **the new 2,940 sq. ft Summer Staff/Seasonal Retreat cabin**. The cabin has 4 bedrooms with bathrooms housing up to 32 summer staff, a meeting area, and two external bathrooms for adjacent staff cabin use. This winterized cabin is located on the western edge of the property. By locating all the summer staff in one area of camp, we will have 3 more cabins in the center of camp for camper use.

Other Sky Ranch Highlights:

- We have been upgrading other facilities to meet a growing demand from retreat groups.
 Volunteers combined to contribute over 2,000 hours of service to improve facilities and grounds at Sky Ranch. Last summer we:
 - Built a new footbridge over Beaver Creek
 - Replaced all benches at Sondance worship area
 - Constructed a covered grill area in the Chuckwagon area
 - Finished replacing heaters in camper cabins and upstairs of Lodge
 - Built a new archery shed
 - Replaced exterior siding on Bonhoeffer Cabin
 - Built new picnic tables and a new bench/storage area outside the Lodge
- Sky Ranch has a rich tradition of training staff to be church leaders regardless of their vocation.
 Of the 10 college graduates on last summer's staff, Sky Ranch has:
 - Two starting the candidacy process with the ELCA
 - One serving with Lutheran Volunteer Corps in Minneapolis
 - One in Rwanda with YAGM (Young Adults Global Mission)
 - One teaching
 - Two in Graduate School for a Master's (one Social Work, one in Education)
 - One serving a not-for-profit formerly associated with Border Servant Corps

Did you know? Sky Ranch owns 117 acres of land and maintains 26 buildings and facilities. In this outdoor setting, dynamic college-age counselors ignite the faith of youth and adults alike and are inspired in their own faith.

Only 2/3 of the camp's budget comes from program fees. Your financial support is vital to keeping camp affordable! We hope you will include Sky Ranch in your missional budget and continue to support this ministry.
